# 2023 Conference Judge Going With the Flow of Watercolor with Leslie Lambert

Thursday, Friday & Saturday 9 am - 4 pm



2023 ANAC Judge, Leslie Lambert

Leslie Lambert, also known as Leslie Redhead, is an award-winning artist, teacher, illustrator, and author known for her dramatic watercolors. Her art focuses on the combination of spontaneity and detail that watercolor has to offer. Leslie enjoys exploring the possibilities of the medium beyond its limitations by spraying and pouring the paint which captures the essence of light, atmosphere, and motion in a unique way.

Leslie was born in Sandy, Utah within views of the Wasatch Mountain range and the Great Salt Lake. When she was 9 years old, her family moved to Ashton, Maryland, a suburb of Washington D.C. Leslie's mother, also an artist, began taking her on excursions to the National Gallery of Art and other museums to experience the many possibilities of how to create and portray the world around her. While at university, Leslie decided to do scientific illustration, graduating from Brigham Young University with a degree in Zoology.

Leslie eventually moved to the Boston area and then to Canada where she became a popular instructor of art. Leslie was led to pursue a Master's in Art Education at the University of Victoria in Victoria, BC. This program was studio based, granting her the time and space to investigate her work in depth. This is where Leslie refined her method of pouring paint, among other techniques.

Leslie's paintings are in private and corporate collections worldwide. Her recent awards include

First Place in Winterfest (2022) sponsored by Trails End Gallery (Chewelah, Washington), International Women in Watercolor Finalist and Honorable Mention (2022), Northwest Watercolor Society Membership Award (2020) and Best in Show with the Idaho Watercolor Society (2019). In addition to signature status with the Northwest Watercolor Society (NWWS), Leslie is an associate member of the Women Artists of the West (WAOW) and a signature member of the Canadian Society of Painters in Water Colour. Leslie is the author of Watercolor 365: Daily Tips, Tricks, and Techniques and the illustrator of Island in the Salish Sea, by Sheryl McFarlane. Her work has been published in Splash 10: The Best of Watercolor, Western Art Collector, Plein Air Magazine, Watercolor Artist, The Artist's Network, and Making It!: Case Studies of Successful Canadian Artists. Leslie continues to teach with the University of Victoria, throughout Canada, the U.S., Spain, and Morocco. Leslie is represented by Trails End Gallery in Chewelah, WA; Horizon Fine Art in Jackson, WY; and Kube Gallery in Fort Langley, BC.

# Supply List

#### **Paints**

I use Winsor & Newton and Daniel Smith brands, but any professional brand of watercolor paint will work. Only three primary colors will be used for this workshop. You may use any yellow, red, or blue that you prefer from the suggested list below:

## Please only choose 3 colors!

- Yellows, Reds, Blues
- Winsor Yellow/Lemon (WN) Quinacridone Rose (DS) Winsor Blue (green shade-WN)
- Transparent Yellow (WN) Quinacridone Red (DS) Thalo Blue (same as Winsor Blue)
- Cadmium Yellow Pale/Light Permanent Rose (WN)(is same as quinacridone rose)
- Indanthrene Blue (DS)
- Aureolin Winsor Red (WN)
- Permanent Alizarin Crimson

### Paper


 $\frac{1}{2}$  sheet (15x22") and (2)  $\frac{1}{4}$  sheets (11x15") of 140 lb. or 300 lb. of 100% cotton watercolor paper. I prefer Arches or Winsor & Newton, but the most important thing is that it is 100% cotton! Some of the less expensive brands have wood pulp in the fibers and do not work as well. Please stretch the  $\frac{1}{2}$  sheet onto a board and bring another board for the quarter sheets.

#### Brush

A good quality #6 or #8 round watercolor brush, a 2" hake or wash brush, and an old, inexpensive brush to use for mixing paint and lifting.

## **Other**

Three small containers to mix paint in (I use laundry scoopers or dollar store measuring cups)

# En Plein Air Painting with Jim Davis

Thursday & Friday 9 am - 4 pm

#### WHAT TO EXPECT

This is a two-day workshop on how to paint outdoors, on location. (En Plein Air)

It is intended for older participants (15 years and above) of all skill levels. Beginners should have a basic understanding of mixing color and using their art medium. It is open to all art mediums but is more suited to oil painters.

We will focus on the fundamentals of painting on location and how to do a small painting from start to finish in one setting. We will learn about supplies needed and how to transport them, finding a scene and setting up to paint, finding a focal point using composition, contrast and color while

using a limited palette to paint an impression of what we see. We will talk about the importance of painting from life and how to get over the fear of painting in public.

We will spend a good part of the time outside painting - weather permitting.

Some local traveling to reach painting locations may be necessary. (Within five miles of the classroom)

The course will also cover important tips on safety while

painting and practical tips on plein air painting techniques.

This is a hands-on workshop which is intended to be fun, informative, and safe. We are all students when it comes to painting and we learn from each other so comments, questions and suggestions are highly encouraged.

If you are an artist who has had an interest in painting outdoors

on location but has not done so for whatever reason this course is for you!

Come and learn with us, make new friends, meet up with some old ones and enjoy a few days of creating art in the great outdoors.

#### Your Instructor

Jim Davis is a largely self-taught artist who currently resides in Columbus, Nebraska. Painting in oil and watercolor since 2002, he

has gained a clientele that consists of art collectors and followers, not only from Nebraska, but from states such as Colorado, Texas, Oklahoma, Tennessee, Arizona, and Iowa. As a member of the Columbus Area Artists he has shown many of his works in local art exhibits and has won numerous awards in local competitions including Best of Show honors in 2009, 2013 and 2017. He has spent the last several years painting "en plein air" or outside in the open air and plans to participate in plein air events and workshops in the upcoming years. He has completed many commissioned works for clients and continues to do larger paintings in his home studio. #### Your Instructor

Diane grew up in Humphrey, Nebraska where she now lives with her husband, and where she and her husband raised their four boys. She graduated from Kearney with a K-12 art education degree. Later she earned a Master of Arts from Wayne State. Diane has been a member of Columbus Area Artists for decades and is currently on the ANAC board where she serves on the exhibit committee. She previously taught 7-12 art at Lakeview High School for 16 years and is now in her fourth year at David City Public Schools. Her media of choice is acrylic or oil paints. The subject matter she prefers wavers between grassy landscapes and, more recently, florals.

## Figure Proportion Drawing

Diane teaches figure drawing four times a year to different groups of students, helping them draw adult figures accurately. This morning class will delve into the proportion of head-to: torso, arms, and legs. Participants will observe the ratio(s) between them and will also observe the ratio of head-to-body parts in children and babies.

# Create Metal Art Out of Steel Using the Plasma Cutting Process NO EXPERIENCE REQUIRED!

Let your imagination run wild creating your own "one-of-a-kind" metal art piece. The first hour of the session will cover operating a plasma cutter and safety discussions. The remainder of the session will be open lab time to work on your own artwork.

Total Cost: \$20. Fee includes scrap metal for practice, 18" X 18" piece of metal for your project and use of the professional safety equipment.

#### Your Instructor

Landon Hunt is in his fourth year as a Welding Instructor at Central Community College (CCC) in Columbus, NE. He received his two-year degree from CCC-Hastings Campus in May of 2013. While attending college, Landon competed in numerous welding competitions and earned first place in Welding Fabrication through Skills USA. Landon has worked in various welding jobs throughout the United States including pipe welding, manufacturing, and fabrication. He is certified welding Inspector (CWI) for the American Welding Society and holds a certification in robotic welding. In his instructional position on the Columbus Campus, Landon teaches all four

major welding types, cutting and other various welding processes. In his spare time, Landon is the owner and operator of a welding

# Learn the Basics of Jewelry Making Earrings or Pendants

Ages 12-adult, Minimum 5: Maximum 15 participants Workshop Fee \$60 per person includes materials and equipment

Take home some delightful dangly earrings or a pendant/necklace that you'll make. Learn basic metal preparation, bending, hammering, texturing, cold connections, and how to make findings like ear wires, jump rings, clasps, or bails. Lynette will guide you through developing skills with tools and how to develop your own original and unique jewelry. Common tools, copper and silver sheet and wire, and equipment will be provided for your use in class.

Because equipment is limited, if you have any of the following tools and supplies, please bring them to class for your own use: small hammer, jewelry pliers, wire cutter, sheet metal scissor or cutter, round nose plier, jewelry files, or hammers, letter or shape stamps, favorite beads, or crystals.

#### Your Instructor

Creating is a passion Lynette cannot stop, obsessively seeking ideas and problem solving with color, texture, and patterns to inspire. The tactile experience of creating is invigorating. Taking ambiguity and making sense of it is a desire in each work created. Lynette loves to share ideas with others and generate appreciation and understanding of how the artist's mind works.

Lynette's jewelry is meticulously engineered from materials that personally speak to the artist and wearer. The materials dictate the design of items ranging from natural to discarded man-made objects. You might favor a raw natural stone or the vibrant whimsical colored beads that are incorporated into her creations. Sterling silver and copper become the medium for the design and fabrication.

Lynette Fast is an active artist and art educator. She earned her Bachelor of Fine Arts in Education degree from University of Nebraska, Lincoln and has continued many graduate hours of study in art and education at Doane College, University of Nebraska, and many workshops and seminars. Fast is an accomplished artist who has exhibited work in juried competitions and group shows and has worked in galleries and private collections across the world.

- Colors White, black, red, yellow, and blue.

Wendy is a super energetic teacher and always brings the coolest door prizes.



# 2023 Conference Exhibit Rules

Review Rules Carefully To Ensure Your Work Will Be Seen By The Judge

# 1. ENTRIES: All works must not have been shown previously in an ANAC exhibit

- Two-dimensional work shall not exceed 40 inches wide by 40 inches high. The 40 inches includes the frame. All work must be properly framed or have exposed perimeter edges finished consistent with the art piece. Work must be ready for hanging (use screw eyes and wire, NO SAWTOOTHS) and must be framed using Plexiglas (except pastels). Gallery wrapped canvas is acceptable without a frame, but the canvas edges must be painted around the sides. Edges must be lapped and ALL STAPLES MUST BE COVERED. If chosen for the travel show, ANAC will provide the carry case. \*\*\*\*Any two-dimensional artwork which has glass as a medium must provide a travel container with the same requirements as three-dimensional artwork.
- Three-dimensional work (free standing or relief on the wall) shall not exceed 36" in any direction. It shall not exceed 75 pounds in weight. The 75 pounds includes the weight of the packing box. A traveling container, (even if it hangs on the wall) of quality construction in proportion to your artwork is required. If upon inspection the exhibit board votes that the container is not of sufficient construction to withstand the rigors of travel, the piece will NOT be eligible for judging. All 3-D shipping containers MUST REMAIN with the artwork until the judging is completed. The Exhibit Board will return the containers to the club packing storage area after judging. All 3-D artists must provide a pedestal (if needed) for the conference show only. If the piece is chosen to travel, each club that participates is responsible for having a proper pedestal to safely display the artwork. Eliminating traveling pedestals should cut down excess size and weight.

# 2. THE NUMBER OF ENTRIES FOR EACH CLUB IS DETERMINED AS FOLLOWS:

a - Quotas: New members may join your club up to March 1 to be counted toward your club's quota of entries for the Exhibit. The quota is 1/3 of the club's membership (rounded) plus 3. The quota is based on the records of the Membership Chairman and Treasurer (paid memberships).

- b. Number of entries -Each club will receive its quota according to ANAC membership records.
- c. Only ANAC members can enter and may exhibit through one club only.
- $\mbox{d.}$  A maximum of two art pieces may be exhibited by an ANAC member.
- e. Work must have been completed in the last two years.
- f. Work must not have been previously shown at ANAC. This includes closely copied images from any of your previous ANAC submitted work.
- 3. An \$8.00 entry fee shall be paid for each piece of art. Each club is requested to send one check to cover all their entries.
- 4. The ANAC Art Exhibit will be confined to original works in drawing, printmaking, collage, painting, photography, pottery, sculpture, textiles, and blown glass. If your work was done using a computer, please attach a sheet explaining the program and/or process used. To conform to the spirit of competition all work MUST BE ORIGINAL. No copies from other artists or published material will be allowed. No supervised work will be allowed. Source material must be available on request. The decision of the Exhibit Board as to eligibility will be final. The \$8.00 entry fee will not be returned if your work is rejected. Questionable pieces will be removed from the show during judging and then re-hung for the remainder of the show. Each entry must include the artist's entry statement COMPLETELY ANSWERED and signed by the artist. Each club chair should be responsible for proofreading these entry statements.
- 5. All work MUST BE PROPERLY IDENTIFIED with the label from the lower part of the entry form or work may be rejected.
- 6. All work must be retained in the exhibit for the duration of the exhibit and/or travel show.
- 7. Artwork in the Traveling Show cannot be sold by a commercial gallery or any other Travel Show site without first contacting the artist. The artist will deal directly with the buyer. ANAC will not be involved or responsible for any sales made.
- 8. The Executive Board and Exhibit Board can make changes to the annual exhibit and travel show at any time.




